GOD SPEAKS

THERE IS GREAT POWER IN FORGIVENESS BOTH FOR THE ONE WHO IS FORGIVEN AND ALSO FOR THE ONE WHO FORGIVES.

1. FORGIVENESS

²¹ Then Peter came to Him and said, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?" ²² Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven. Matthew 18:21-22

2. FORGIVENESS FROM GOD'S

²³ Therefore the kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. ²⁴ And when he had begun to settle accounts, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. ²⁵ But as he was not able to pay, his master commanded that he be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and that payment be made. ²⁶ The serv-ant therefore fell down before him, saying, 'Master, have patience with me, and I will pay you all.²⁷ Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt. Matthew 18:23-27

3. FORGIVENESS FOSTERS

³⁵ "So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother ^[c]his trespasses." *Matthew* 18:35
